Thanks for joining us at the 8th Annual Butler County Social Services Resource Expo. While this year's "drive thru" event looks a little different than it normally does, we are excited to continue to provide valuable information while keeping everyone safe and healthy. We will continue to look for creative ways to help you connect, learn and network throughout the year.

The Butler County Family and Children First Council (FCFC) strives to streamline and disseminate information about the available supports and services in our community. Last year, we reached 2,331 people with our FCFC newsletter, we hosted 34 professional development events for 2,010 individuals with 41 partner agencies, and distributed over 26,000 community resource cards.

Our council's mission is to work with public and private partners to improve the well-being for families and children. We work with individuals, families, communities and systems to study data trends & gaps in services and bridge those with collaborations. This year we are:

- Strengthening our **No Wrong Door** initiative to seamlessly connect our families with resources.
- Hosting **free and low-cost trainings** with CEUs to improve your knowledge, skills, and abilities!
